MCC to welcome College Promise students this fall

Mesa Mayor John Giles and Mesa Community College Interim President Lori M. Berquam, Ph.D., announce that the first Mesa College Promise eligible high school graduates will receive funding to attend MCC beginning with the fall 2021 semester.

Each student accepted into the program will have their own academic advisor plus career and financial aid advising. Also, students receive all the free MCC services such as tutoring, parking, counseling, job skill assistance and the food pantry.

The Mesa College Promise is a commitment from the city to residents that eligible graduating high school students who reside in Mesa may apply to attend MCC for two years free.

This flagship program covers tuition and fees remaining after funds from the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or other scholarships are applied.
