





There were six crimes reported in 2021 — compared to 16 in 2020 and nine in 2019 — at two Mesa Community College campuses and a downtown center in the Maricopa County Community College District, according to a federally mandated campus-security report released in October.

Pandemic restrictions — including closing campuses and moving to online coursework — contributed to the fewer crimes in this latest report, Sgt. Jack McClaren of the Maricopa County Community Colleges Police Department said.

Community policing and partnerships wi helped the MCC campuses remain mostly McClaren said.

We also just released our 'September Campus Safety Awareness Month' tips to faculty, staff and students," he said. "We have good partnerships with surrounding police agencies to assist us in keeping our campuses safe.

Outreach is done at campuses and centers on crime prevention and to encourage crime reporting.


## Statistics must be reported

The Student Right to Know and Campus Security Act of 1990, renamed The Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security and Crime Statistics Act, was enacted by Congress and signed into law in November 1990. In 1992, 2000, 2008 and 2013, Congress amended the law via the Higher Education Opportunity and Violence Against Women acts, which expanded the reporting criteria.



No crimes were determined to be unfounded and no hate crimes were reported for all three years.


The MCCCD Police Department office is on the west side of the SC building (building 14), on the southwest side of the campus, according to the Clery report.


"We had several golf carts stolen (joy riding) and mostly recovered. Those golf carts are Clery reportable," he said. "To stop the thefts (joy riding) of the golf carts, MCC police has directed all staff golf carts to be secured behind a locked gate at the motor pool and/or a locking system attached to the steering wheel of the golf carts when not in use. This added deterrent has drastically reduced golf cart thefts (joy riding)."
