Where you work and what it does: Chandler-Gilbert Community College and Mesa Community College. The community colleges are central to Arizona's goal of 60% of the workforce having a post-high school credential, providing workforce certifications, associates (and soon bachelors) degrees, and other lifelong learning opportunities.

**Education:** Bachelor's degree, accountancy, Arizona State University; master's in public administration, ASU; doctoral candidate, adult and higher education, Oregon State University

**The top item on your bucket list:** I'll be focusing on completing the final pieces of my doctoral dissertation.

That said, recognizing that there are limits to my own perspective and seeking insights and inspiration to fill those gaps has proven to be a smart way to do better and to fend off the doubts that creep in.
