Dr. Mark Milliron '88 is President and CEO of the League for Innovation in the Community College. The League is an international organization dedicated to

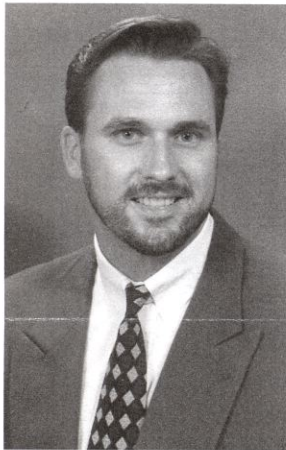

According to Dr. Milliron, his passion for the community college began when he was a student at MCC – an experience that provided a “pathway to possibilities.”

Dr. Milliron is the first in his family of nine children to receive a college degree. In reflecting on his experience at MCC, he noted several faculty members who influenced positively his educational experience:

Jim Mancuso, Speech and Communication, taught him to love learning for the sake of learning – not to focus on grades; Rick Meyers, Math, taught habits of success such as discipline and dealing with details; and Charles Evans, Theatre Arts, showed him the importance of keeping the spark of creativity. The combination of experiences at MCC left Dr. Milliron well prepared for his studies at Arizona State University.

Dr. Milliron graduated summa cum laude from ASU with a B.S. in Organizational Communication and Masters in Organizational Communication. He received his Ph.D. in Educational Administration from the University of Texas at Austin where he was a Kellogg Senior Research Fellow.

MCC Student Assessment Program Recognized as National Model

Mesa Community College faculty have developed a nationally recognized, comprehensive program to assess student learning outcomes. The assessment program enables the college to measure and document the degree to which students achieve certain learning outcomes valued and defined by the faculty. The program is built around three primary assessment areas – general education, career and technical education, and developmental education. In general education, learning outcomes such as written and oral communication, scientific inquiry, and problem solving are assessed, while outcomes such as ethics, organization, and personal and

professional responsibilities are assessed in the career and technical program.

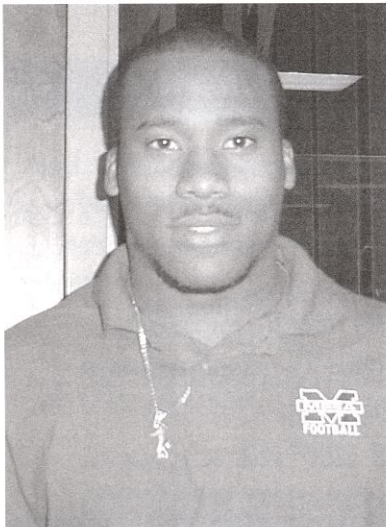
The assessment program provides clear evidence of student learning at MCC! Results show that students completing their general education significantly outperform students beginning their studies. The assessment program has become a cornerstone of MCC's academic program, allowing the college to document the impact of the college experience on student learning and to use results to improve current programs.

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Thunderbird Athletes Win Top Honors

Mesa Community College football player Rashad Armstrong was recently recognized as the 2001 Offensive Player of the Year by the National Junior College Athletic Association. Rashad, a 5'9" 205 pound running back from Miami, Florida, joined the Mesa team in 2000. Limited due to injuries during his first season, Rashad exploded onto the NJCAA football scene in 2001. Over the ten game season, Rashad scored 16 touchdowns and gained



1,373 yards on 221 carries, breaking a 31 year old rushing record at MCC previously held by Jimmy Smith. Rashad gained an additional 260 yards in pass receiving, giving him 1,633 yards in total offense. MCC finished the 2001 season with a 5-5 record, with four of the five losses being one touchdown or less. Rashad is currently majoring in sociology and plans to go into social work upon graduation. He is considering offers from Ohio State, Auburn, Oregon, USC, Clemson, Oklahoma and Florida for the 2002-2003 academic year.



Other fall sports include Men's and Women's Soccer, Track and Field, Cross Country, and Volleyball. The Men's Soccer team concluded the 2001 season with an overall record of 17-3 and won 2nd place in the Arizona Community College Athletic Conference (ACCAC). Jamon Lifsey was named ACCAC Player of the Year and NJCAA 1st All-American. The Women's Soccer team concluded the 2001 season with an overall record of 21-2 and are the 2001 ACCAC and Region 1 Champions. Melissa Miller was 2001 ACCAC and Region 1 Player of the Year. Melissa was also named 1st team NJCAA All-American, making 2001 the 3rd consecutive year that a Mesa player has won the award (Shannon Tenney 1999 and

Krista Hecker 2000). Danny Sanchez, coach of both the Men's and Women's Soccer team, was named ACCAC Coach of the Year for both teams.

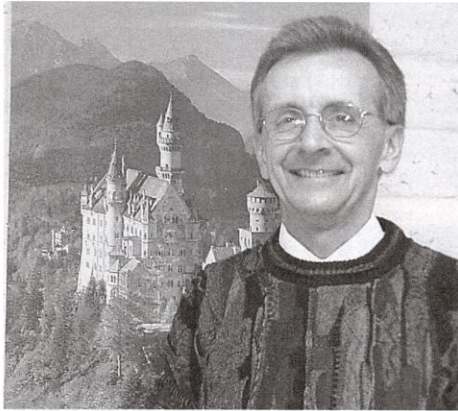
Music major receives the prestigious Maxi Award

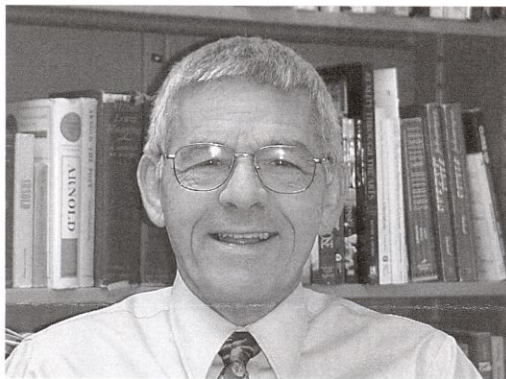

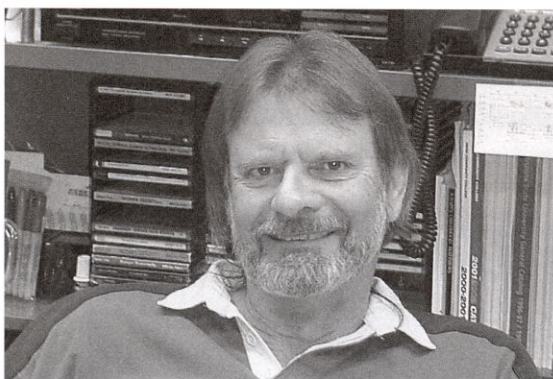
MCC Thanks Retirees for Years of Dedicated Service



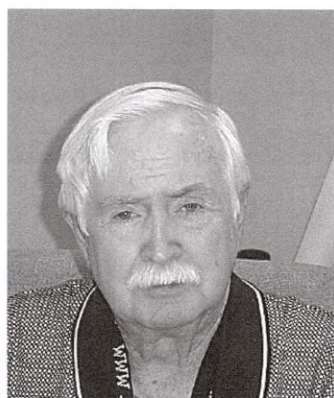
