### Middle, Junior High and High School Outreach



Mesa Community College, under the direction of Dr. Pan, has designed an outreach plan to work together with the East Valley educational community. The plan is based on the belief that although we serve different student populations, ultimately all educators share the same grand mission – to prepare students for informed and productive lives in a global, knowledge-based economy.

To support this plan, MCC is working with our service area's middle, junior high and high schools. MCC leadership recently held a breakfast meeting with area high school administrators and discussed possible ways to work together. On the middle and junior high school level, MCC is currently providing each school with one designated contact person from MCC leadership who will be available to work with that school to welcome younger students to a variety of enrichment activities on campus. The designated MCC contact person will be calling upon the schools this month to discuss possible ways to work together.

The goal of the program is to touch the life of each student in MCC's service area so that the idea of attending college is an exciting and attainable reality for their future.s.

## **Security Plan Update**

#### **Door locks:**

We are still in the process of changing all the door hardware to push button locks at the Southern and Dobson campus. We had hoped to be done by now, but some of the hardware had to be returned to the vendors. The Red Mountain campus has significantly more electronic locks than Southern and Dobson.

All door locks are being rekeyed department by department and we will reissue keys to every department. We'll have a record of every person who has a key, which puts more responsibility on the employee and they will be responsible for returning the key when they leave employment at MCC.



#### Alertus, the all-hazards campus emergency alert system:

We have 20 of the 60 Alertus systems installed at the Southern and Dobson campus. We have tested them and they are working well. We plan to install the peripheral equipment such as the scrolling marquees in the coming month. There are no systems at the Red Mountain campus because it is not as spread out as the Southern and Dobson campus.

#### **Educational Video and email updates:**

MCC's Public Safety website will soon have a video with instructions for a lockdown scenario. We will provide the link when it is available and send periodic updates on lockdown procedures by email. MCC has a partially functional lockdown now and we hope to have a fully functional lockdown institution-wide within a month or so.

#### **Department training and drills:**

In addition to the lockdown video, we offer individual department training. Please contact the Public Safety Department at 46l-7046 to schedule training for your department. Ongoing large-scale training for employees is also taking place. So far we have had two drills, with two or three more drills scheduled for the fall semester. During the last two drills, we identified several issues with the equipment and are working on improving efficiency.

#### **Crisis Management:**

Ongoing crisis management meetings are taking place with the leadership from administrative areas, public safety, institutional advancement, maintenance and operations, and occupational health and safety working together to make MCC a secure campus.

#### **Downtown and Williams Campuses**

College Safety will be hiring an officer for the Downtown campus this fall. Security for MCC programs located at the Willaims campus is handled by Chandler-Gilbert Community College.

## **Triage and Welcome/Concierge Programs**

A new energy of helpfulness is visible on campus with the rollout of the new Triage and Welcome/Concierge Programs.

More than 20 volunteers from all areas of MCC assisted—and continue to assist—students as they enroll in classes and tackle the first few weeks of fall semester. Volunteers help the students cope with long wait times, hot weather and questions galore.

"We've been really happy with the turnout," said Greg Reentz, director of Student Life and Leadership. "On behalf of the participants, I think they've really enjoyed it and we want to thank them for helping the students as they embark on their educational journey." The Triage Program is comprised of staff and faculty volunteers who walk waiting lines in the Enrollment Services areas and provide general information for students who are enrolling. Volunteers are needed throughout the year for peak times such as enrollment, drop/add, early registration, etc.

The Welcome/Concierge Program is comprised of federal work study students and MCC staff who work the welcome booths, helping students find classrooms and campus resources.
