1. Act One Culture Pass

5. Mesa Desert Trails Park and East Valley Canal Loop for Bike Riders, Runners and Walkers

to-do/parks-recreation-commercial-facilities/parks/desert-trails-park) is a neighborhood favorite at the northeast corner of McDowell and Recker in Mesa that has varied routes to explore. Young, inexperienced riders as well as experienced bikers love to hit the trails here. Plus, it makes a really fun short hike if you don't bring your bike, with a fantastic view of the entire city of Mesa. **The East Valley Canal Loop** is a 21-mile loop that begins at the Guadalupe Road/Greenfield Road area in Gilbert and extends north to McDowell Road in Mesa and back down again. 6. Usery Mountain Regional Park in Mesa

On the east side of Mesa, Usery Mountain Regional Park consists of 3,648 acres adjacent to the Tonto National Forest. It's a hiker's and photographer's paradise, teeming with desert wildlife and a gorgeous place to watch a stunning Arizona sunset. Biking, hiking, camping, horseback riding—you name it, you can find it—on one of the 20 hiking trails. One of the most popular trails, the Wind Cave Trail, culminates in the Wind Cave, a natural feature formed by dripping water over thousands of years. 7. Mesa Bass Pro Events

Interested in learning more about fishing, archery and other outdoor sports? Let the crew at Bass Pro Shop at 1133 N. Dobson Rd. in Mesa help with tips on safety and enjoyment. They have a Kids Night event every Tuesday from 5 p.m. – 8 p.m. that features live fish feeding and free popcorn. They also offer Boy Scout Merit Badge classes. 8. Mesa Airport Viewing Areas

If you love planes, head out to **Falcon Field**, 4800 E. Falcon Drive in Mesa. The airport opened in 1941 and served as a World War II pilot training base. There are more than 700 aircraft based at Falcon Field, including fixed-wing single- and multi-engine aircraft, turboprops, jets and helicopters. Falcon Field Airport is home to a variety of aviation organizations and pilot groups who host a variety of events, from community pancake breakfasts to fly-ins, to share their aircraft and love of flying, mentor young pilots, and raise money for charity.

The public is welcome to enjoy two aircraft viewing areas at the Falcon Field Airport terminal building: a patio behind the terminal and a separate lawn area on the east side of the building. Both areas face the aircraft parking ramp and offer close-up views of fixed-wing aircraft and helicopters on the ramp, taxiways and runways. Free binoculars are available in both viewing areas.

Free gliders can be obtained inside the terminal office during business hours that children can fly on the miniature runway in the lawn area. Pack a lunch and make an afternoon of it! Falcon Field Airport information (http://www.falconfieldairport.com/my-community/tours-speakers-aircraft-viewing).

9. Williams Gateway Airport Viewing Area on Power and Ray roads in southeast

10. Sloan Park in Mesa

Thrill the baseball fan in your family by getting a major league player's autograph! Sloan Parkbaseball(http://chicago.cubs.mlb.com/chc/mesa/), 2330 West Rio Salado Parkway in Mesa, is the spring training home of
the Chicago Cubs, with games scheduled in March. Time permitting, players and coaches may sign autographs
up until 30 minutes prior to the game. Fans seeking autographs following the game may have the opportunity to

Connected to Sloan Park is Mesa Riverview Park, with an urban fishing lake, softball fields, fountains and other cool water features and a large playground for kids. The playground includes a 50-foot climbing tower, a 60-foot mesh rope climbing structure, restrooms, shaded picnic areas and lots of open play areas as well.

11. Mesa Community College Events

You don't have to be a college student to attend many of the free events and activities at Mesa Community College, 1833 W. Southern Ave, Mesa. For example, there's no entrance fee to MCC's Art Gallery, which features a wide range of works in painting, ceramics, photography and electronic media. And it's always great to take a stroll around The Rose Garden at MCC (http://rosegarden.mesacc.edu/home.html), home to 9,000 rose bushes, free and open to the public. For the starry-eyed, free "Astronomy Nights (https://www.mesacc.edu/departments/physicalscience/astronomy/planetarium/astronomy-nights)" in the 52-seat, state-of-the-art Planetarium are held on the first Friday night of every month.

Interested in desert animals and endangered species? MCC's Red Mountain campus, 7110 E. McKellips Rd., Mesa, has a cienega that is a Wildlife Certified Habitat and home to endangered native desert pupfish and desert tortoises.

There's also a terrarium in the lobby of the Saguaro Building, with snakes, lizards and gila monsters! And throughout the year many sports, cultural and community-oriented events take place on both campuses. MCC Facebook event link (https://www.facebook.com/mesacc /events)

12. Chandler-Gilbert Community College Events
