## Governing board member Miranda dead at 64

Ben Miranda, member of the Maricopa County Community College District governing board, died Nov. 15. He was 64.

Mr. Miranda was a Vietnam War veteran, former legislator and advocate for the Latino community.

He was married to state Rep. Catherine Miranda. The cause of his death was unknown as of press time.

Maricopa Community Colleges Chancellor Rufus Glasper said in a press release that although Mr. Miranda had only been a board member since January, he had proven he was committed to education.

"His service here was just the most recent example of his dedication to the community. Both personally and on behalf of the governing board and the Maricopa Community Colleges, I want to offer our condolences to his wife, Catherine, and to his family. He will be missed throughout the community," Mr. Glasper said in the press release.

### Mesa Community College to host holiday concert
