

Free human trafficking presentation at local college campuses Updated March 12, 2015

Two visiting <u>Hubert H. Humphrey Fellows</u> will make presentations on human trafficking Monday, March 23 at <u>Mesa Community College</u> and Wednesday, March 25 at <u>Scottsdale Community College</u>.

Milos Dordevic, senior criminal police investigator with the Ministry of the Interior in Serbia, and Vanessa Fusco Nogueira Simões, a public prosecutor and creator of the first cyber-crime prosecution office in Brazil, will discuss trafficking prevention efforts in their regions.
