'Learn to Earn' summer program to launch in Mesa

Mesa Counts on College, a partnership involving the city, Mesa Community College and Mesa Public Schools to increase post-secondary completion for Mesa high-school grads, is launching a "Learn to Earn" summer program for current high-school juniors who are at least 17 years old.

OVERVIEW

Students will spend four weeks of a six-week program at Arizona Regional Medical Center, Mountain Vista Hospital and Banner-Cardon Children's Medical Center. Participants will choose a career to explore, including imaging, lab services, business/administrative services, nursing, hospital plant operations, supply chain, nutritional services, pharmacy, child life services, perioperative services or therapy services. College preparation activities are scheduled for the final week and include field trips to local higher-education institutions and visits by Mesa colleges and university representatives.
