New Frontiers for Lifelong Learning, an organization of over 400 members operating under the auspices of Mesa Community College, has scheduled an open house next week to introduce people to its large array of fall courses and programs.

After paying \$80 per year or \$60 per semester, members can register for as many classes as they want, though some have an additional fee for materials. Subjects include history, art, music, health, computers, photography, nature, and book reviews. A number of social programs, including luncheons, tours, traveling, plays, board and card games and concerts, also are held.

Many members volunteer on the MCC campuses and in the community in various ways and MCC student IDs given to all members entitle them to discounts at various local businesses. Classes meet on the MCC campuses at Southern Avenue and Dobson Road, McKellips and Power roads, 165 N. Centennial Way. They also are held at the Mesa Active Adult Center, 247 N. Macdonald, Red Mountain Active Adult Center, 7550 E. Adobe Road, and other locations in Mesa.

The open house is 1-3 p.m. Friday, Sept. 20, at the Downtown MCC campus, 145 N. Centennial Way, fourth floor. Attendees can park in the garage on the second and third levels only.

Registration for classes starts Tuesday, Sept. 24, by computer only if the fee is paid. For those who do not have computers, arrangements will be made. This will be explained at the open house.
