ASU Polytechnic building rededicated to veteran

A building at Williams Air Force Base, now the Arizona State University Polytechnic campus, has been rededicated to honor the memory of Master Sgt. William C. Sutton, a member of the 37th Air Rescue and Recovery Group who died in 1970 during a rescue mission in Laos during the Vietnam War.

A building on the campus was originally dedicated to Sgt. Sutton in 1972 but the plaque was lost during renovations years ago, according to the release. ASU staff located the plaque at an auction earlier this year and it was rededicated in a special ceremony Sept. 19 in the presence of Sgt. Sutton's family.

The event coincided with the reunion of Air Force pilots from the Williams Field Class of '69, according to the release.
