I've also heard from the super-cool Missi Hughes of Desert Wind Harley Davidson, formerly known as Chester's, who said they'll be hosting Turkey Tuesday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. where they'll accept donations of frozen turkeys to benefit United Food bank.

Now this brings up an interesting image of people trying to ride their motorcycles through the streets of Mesa with frozen turkeys on their laps. Now I'm not expert, but it seems to me that would not be a great idea, so it seems like a good time to mention that the United Food Bank also welcomes checks. In past years we've counted one \$25 check as the equivalent of one frozen turkey.

We started this as a turkey drive, but if you're worried about the logistics, you can collect donations made out to United Food Bank, or ask them for a food donation box to put in your lobby.
